She put an ad in the local paper every week, but would not, as the years went by, even consider updating her site or even listing it on those expensive ads. She felt updating her website was too expensive. So as the years went on, most of those 75+ photos were of items she no longer sold.

I think it was more expensive having a website created in the first place that was never changed and more importantly, didn't reflect her changing business.

Website of the Month

What is Crowd Sourcing?

Crowdsourcing is the act of outsourcing tasks, traditionally performed by an employee or contractor, to an undefined, large group of people or community (a "crowd"), through an open call. The term "crowdsourcing" is a combination of "crowd" and "outsourcing," first coined by Jeff Howe in a June 2006 Wired magazine article "[The Rise of Crowdsourcing](#)".

Photography is a good example. The advent of the digital camera, easy to use photo editing software and of course the internet have seen a surge in the availability of [stock photography](#) at a reasonable price. So the quality of photographs created by individuals started to get on par with professionals and you have a larger pool of people to choose from when you are looking for photographs for yourself or your company.

Crowdsourcing can be for design work such as [99designs.com](#). Clients can ask for submissions for designs for anything from business cards to logo design. You state what kind of design you'd like, how much you will pay, and then interested designers will start submitting designs. You choose from the designs submitted and agree to pay what they have asked for (it may be more than you offered, but if it's the perfect logo, you may be willing to pay the higher

5. To monitor the volunteer budget. To maintain volunteer files in a timely and accurate manner. To be responsible for all activities

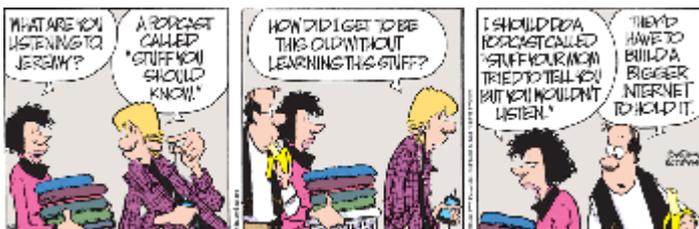

Podcasts



Have you discovered Podcasts yet? The word Podcast comes from the original phrase Webcast (as in Web broadcast) but was soon called a Podcast due to the iPod's popularity.

The proposed definition of a Podcast is "a digital audio or video file that is episodic; downloadable; programme-driven, mainly with a host and/or theme; and convenient, usually via an automated feed with computer software.

The most commonly used software is [iTunes](#), but it is not the only software that can be used. Some Podcasts are summaries of current radio programs, or longer versions of shorter interviews. Some only exist as a Podcast and are not found on the radio at all. You also don't have to have an iPod, you can listen to these programs on your computer or other mp3 players.

I have found myself really jumping into the Podcast media. I can't concentrate on my work with a radio talk show on, but hear of wonderful presenters on stations like [CBC](#), and Podcasting now allows me to listen to them at a time of my own choosing. A few of my favourites are:

You can find podcasts by searching for them on iTunes, or just searching the word Podcast in your favourite search engine.

Music on the Web

I don't really listen to the radio much. I can't seem to find any stations that don't play music that is less than 30 years old! So, I listen to my iPod in the car, or at home and fill it with music that I find from other sources. And where are these sources? Well, you hear about some songs from friends of course, but I find lately, that most of the music that I hear is from the sound tracks of television shows or movies!

You know how hard it is to read the credits on tv though. The stations either cut the credits off at the end, or reduce that screen so they can advertise the next big show that is coming up. While I love the website [IMDB](#) (the Internet Movie Database) for settling discussions on whether this actress is the same one you saw in that other movie, it isn't always great for finding music without a paid subscription.

So, I was very happy to discover a site called [Tune Find](#). You type in the name of the show you heard a song, and then if you know the episode, you can look at all the songs that played, a small preview to see if it is the same one, and the name of the song and the artist. There is a link there to allow you to buy the song from iTunes or Amazon.

There are other sites that also do this, and it is handy because not every site has every show on it. Another one is called [TV Show Music](#).

If you want to listen to these songs for awhile and not buy them, you can set up play lists on other sites. A site called [Grooveshark](#) lets you play random songs you like without signing up (for free) or if you do sign up, you can create playlists that plays the songs one after another. You can even connect to radio stations. There are other sites like this out there, and this is just one that I have found that is simple and works well.
